## This funding will be used to

- Deliver key initiatives in our Explicit Improvement Agenda for 2019
- Support student learning for students at all levels across the college
- Enhance student connectedness with their college
- Provide additional key staff to enhance the learning of students across the college.

## Our initiatives include

- Provision of in excess of 12000 hours of Academic Tutoring for students across the college. These programs will be a range of targeted support interventions as well as optional before, during and after-school tutoring opportunities for all students.
- Provision of the “Collegial Conversations” initiative focussing on teacher professional practice and sharing excellent practice across the college with an explicit intent of improving student learning experiences in every classroom.
- Funding for the additional specialist staff in the Junior School to deliver the explicit improvement agenda.
- Funding the key additional staff to support the futures-focussed initiatives and pathways connections delivered by the Senior Studies Room in the Senior School.
- Provide the Learning Support Coordinators who focus on the enhancement of Literacy and Numeracy skills for identified students in the Junior and Middle Schools.
- Fund additional Learning Support Teacher Aides who work with identified students in both the Junior and Middle Schools.
- Provide additional Guidance Counsellor support throughout the year at key times.
- Provide additional Teacher Librarian time in both the Junior School and Middle and Senior School libraries supporting the reading opportunities across the college.
- Purchase additional time for Year Coordinators to work with smaller groups of students within the college to heighten student connectedness and attendance within the college
- Provision of additional administration support to manage and monitor the learning enhancement and learning consolidation programs.

## Our school will improve student outcomes by

- Delivering over 12000 tutoring hours for students across the college - \$340000

\* Funding amount estimated on 2018 data. Actual funding will be determined after 2019 enrolment data are finalised. Actual expenditure may be varied due to changes in finalised 2019 enrolment data and student learning needs.

- Investing in on-going Collegial Conversations professional learning process where teachers open up their classrooms to their peers and engage in professional growth conversations to enhance teacher practice and student learning - \$85000
- Engaging additional Junior School specialist staff to enhance the leadership and support of the student learning in the Junior School - \$142000
- Maintaining the resources provided to all Senior School students through the Senior Studies Room and the Senior Pathways initiative - \$185000
- Purchasing specialist teacher and teacher-aide time to enhance the learning of students with identified learning needs across the college - \$180000
- Purchasing Learning Support Teacher Aides who work with identified students in both the Junior and Middle Schools - \$50000
- Providing funds to engage specialist support staff for senior students throughout their final years for expert pathways and vocational advice - \$20000
- Providing additional librarian time to promote reading across the college while also catering for the growing number of students accessing the resource - \$20000
- Providing additional Year Coordinator staffing to support the Student Connectedness with the college - \$50000
- Provision of additional administration support to oversee and manage these programs - \$30000
- Provision of the support for acute learning program needs across the college - \$43900
- Maintaining 'The Zone', a multi-dimensional bespoke support service for students covering a broad range of subjects as well as social and emotional support for students at times of duress - \$40000
