






# Preparing for senior school learning

- map their pathway to a Queensland Certificate of Education (QCE).


# Things for students to Consider

The QCE is Queensland's senior schooling qualification.

- Wide range of learning options



## How does the QCE work?

- Set amount: 20 credits
- Set pattern:
  - 12 credits from completed Core courses
  - 8 credits from Core,
     Preparatory &
     Complementary courses
- Satisfactory completion
- Literacy & numeracy



## **Set Amount**



20 credits from a range of learning options:

- QCAA courses
  - General subjects
  - Applied subjects
  - Short Courses
  - Senior External Examination syllabuses
- Vocational Education and Training (VET) certificates or qualifications
- Other recognised studies

### **Set Pattern Core courses**



### 12 credits from completed Core courses:

# Set Pattern Complementary Courses



Maximum of 8 credits from:

Course	Credits per course
University subjects while a student is enrolled at school	up to 4
Diplomas and Advanced Diplomas while a student is enrolled at school	up to 8
Recognised studies categorised as Complementary	as recognised by the QCAA

## **Set Standard**



QCE credits are accrued when the set standard for each subject/course has been met.

Depending on the course, that may be:

- satisfactory completion
- grade of C or better
- competency or qualification completion
- pass or equivalent.

## **Literacy and Numeracy**



- QCAA General or Applied English/Mathematics subjects
- QCAA Short Course in Literacy/Numeracy
- Senior External Examination in a QCAA English/Mathematics subject


## **QCE Pathways**

- The QCE is flexible.
- There is no single pathway.
- A student's pathway will depend on the subjects and courses the school offers and their individual goals.
- Typically, students will study six subjects/courses across Years 11 and 12.

## **VETIS Funding**



VETiS qualifications funded by the VET investment budget are listed on the <u>Priority Skills List</u>. These qualifications are delivered by RTOs who have been approved by the department as pre-qualified suppliers (PQS) under the Certificate 3 Guarantee. Schools, in consultation with students and their parents/carers, are able to choose any PQS approved to deliver the eligible qualification. Students undertaking VETiS programs, funded by the VET Investment budget, can complete one employment stream qualification at the Certificate I or II level.

VETiS qualifications on the Priority Skills List are at the Certificate I and II level. Students who wish to access the VET investment budget to undertake a Certificate III qualification should do so through a school-based apprenticeship or traineeship (SATs), funding for a SAT is available under the User Choice program.


