

150 Years of State **Education at Kelvin** Grove 1875-2025










150 Years Ago









The area's educational roots trace back to 1875 with the establishment of Kelvin Grove Road School on the 3rd May. It was a provisional school situated at the bottom of Long Hill. Mr Thomas Christie was the first head teacher. The school was built at a cost of 600 pounds.







In 1876 the school was moved to the present site, J.W Long was the headmaster until 1883. The provisional school was closed in 1887.








In 1887 the government decided that the growing suburb warranted the establishment of an official state school. Two new state schools were opened. Kelvin Grove State Boys School & Kelvin Grove State Girls' and Infants School









The Boys school was located where the present Senior School is now.

The Girls' and Infants' school was located where the present Junior School is now.

These schools were closed in 1949.









In 1950 the boys and girls schools were amalgamated and became Kelvin Grove Primary School. An infants school was opened on the site where the middle school is now.









In 1960 the State School for Infants was joined with the primary school. In 1961 a new high school was opened with 350 students. By 1965 there were 1100 students.







In 2001 the Kelvin Grove State School amalgamated with the high school and became Kelvin Grove State College.








Historical Artefacts:

Kelvin Grove State School Roll of Honour located in the administration foyer is actually and Honour Board. 208 names of student alumni and teachers wo served in World War 1, 43 of whom were killed in action.









Historical Artefacts:

The bell was placed at the girls school around 1887. The bell was moved around the College grounds until it was placed in its current spot at the front of the Junior Campus.

The bell was only rung by the boys.
